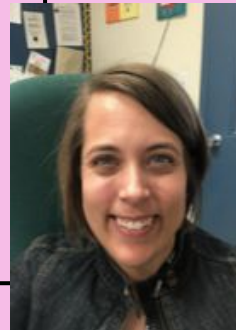

School Lunch Program and Milk

Our school lunch program is scheduled to launch on Monday, October 28th. Families will be able to order from a centralized ordering platform from October 18th-October 23rd. The vendor assigned to our school is Scarlett House Atlantic Div. Inc. They will be preparing the meals offsite and then will deliver them to the school.

More information to follow as we get closer to the dates provided.

As a result to this upcoming change in our lunch program, we will not be offering regular or chocolate milk for purchase. White milk will continue to be available as part of our breakfast program.

Families are responsible to provide lunch until the program is up and running. Please ensure that you include all necessary cutlery as we will not be able to continue to provide extras on a long-term basis..

Arrival Procedures

As communicated in previous messages, there has been a change in arrival at school in the mornings.

At 8:15, staff are on duty and that means that parents/guardians can leave students on the school grounds. You are welcome to stay with your child should you wish.

Students will play outside from 8:15-8:25. At 8:25, a bell will sound indicating that students can now enter the building.

During days of inclement weather or extreme cold, the doors will be opened at 8:15 and students will be allowed to enter the building and head straight to their classrooms.

Health Information

It is important that the school have access to the most up to date health information for your child. Please ensure to update records when requested and please inform us of any changes to your child's health. Medications cannot be administered at school without the proper documentation and they must be kept at the office. If your child requires medication while at school, please call the main office at 902-864-6838 and we will ensure that forms are made available for you to fill out and sign.

Emergency Drills

The start of a new school year requires us to practice being safe while at school. One way we do this is to practice exiting the building in case of a fire. School staff will be discussing this in their classrooms, at age-appropriate levels, this week and we will be doing our first drill later in the week. Another way we practice being safe at school is by participating in what we call Lockdown and Hold and Secure Drills. Look for a separate message with more information regarding this in the coming days. The third way that we practice safety is with bus evacuation drills. This is especially important when classes begin to take field trips. The date for this practice drill has yet to be determined but will be communicated as soon it becomes available..

Head Lice

Please ensure that you are checking your child's head frequently for lice. If you find any live lice, or nits, students can return to school once they have been treated.

Safe Arrival

If your child is going to be late or absent, please remember to call our toll free attendance line at 1-833-582-6940 . The only option available is to excuse the student for the day. If the student arrives later, attendance will be changed upon their arrival.

Curriculum Information

Classroom teachers will be sending home information to families about curriculum via email on September 25th. This will be in place of an in-person curriculum night. Teachers will be communicating about the curriculum outcomes they will be covering, will discuss assessment processes as well as how they will be communicating student learning and progress with you. Once this information comes home and you have had the chance to review, please contact the appropriate teacher directly if you have any questions.

Picture Day

Picture Day will take place on Tuesday, September 24th. Pictures will begin in the morning, with each class taking their turn. Information about ordering will come home with your child on that day.

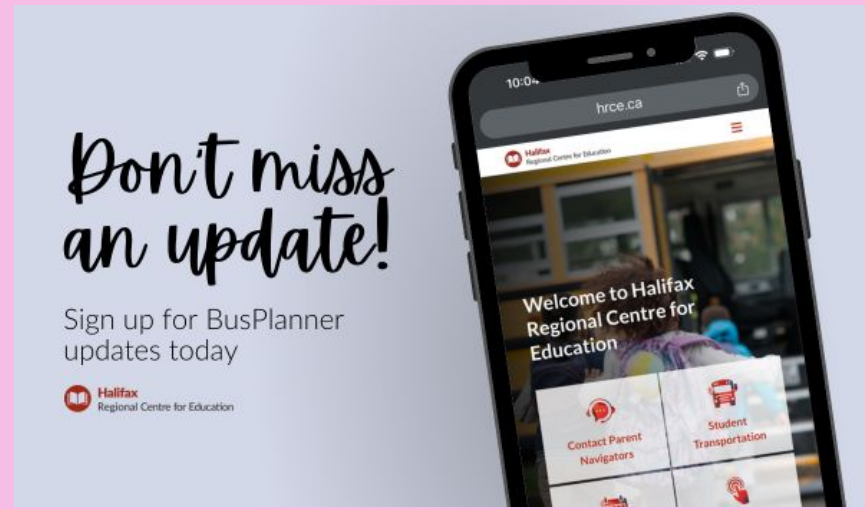
Breakfast Program

As there are **no classes on Monday, September 30th**, we welcome staff , students and families to wear **orange** on Friday, September 27th.



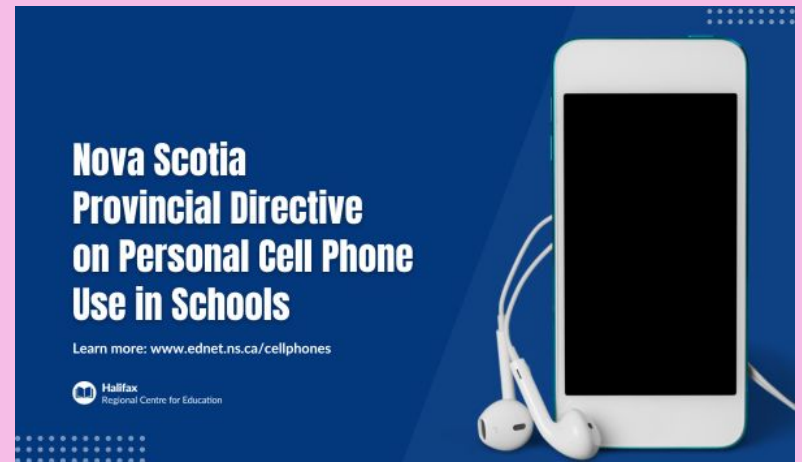
Cell Phones in Schools

Inclement Weather and School Cancellations

In the event of school cancellation due to inclement weather and other exceptional circumstances, the decision to cancel school is made as close to 6 am as possible. Here are some ways you can find out:

At times schools may be cancelled by “Family of Schools”. **We are in the Sackville High family of schools.** In the event school is cancelled during the school day, the decision is usually made by 11 am. The school will contact all families to confirm procedures to release your children. Please ensure your child knows what to do in case of early closure and ensure that your phone numbers and email addresses are up-to-date so we can contact you. Students are not released until we have made contact with a parent/guardian or designate as you have previously identified.

If school is cancelled during the day, we will dismiss students as per their parent/guardian instruction at 11:30 am. If you can avoid it, do not come to pick your child up early as this will result in a number of parents/guardians in close contact. Parents, guardians and caregivers are requested to wait outside their regular dismissal door at 11:30 am for their children. All students who need to wait for a later pick-up will be supervised until they are picked up.

On days when conditions exist that it is not safe to open schools at the regularly scheduled time but it is predicted that conditions will improve, a 2-hour delayed opening may be considered. In this situation, students cannot arrive before 10:25 and classes will begin at 10:35. Lunch and dismissal times will not be affected.
