

#### Reminders


- Please send students with a water bottle each day.

#### **Volunteering and Field Trips**

If you would like to volunteer as a chaperone, it is a requirement of HRCE to have a recent Child Abuse Registry Check and Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector on file within 3 months of date of issue. We can provide you with a letter that gives a discount on the Criminal Records Check with Vulnerable Sector fee so please contact the office if you are interested. If any associated fees are a concern for you, please reach out to us.

The Child Abuse Registry application form is free and can be completed on-line.

#### **Class Placements**

We will soon begin the process of configuring classrooms for next year, while acknowledging there may be changes due to the fluctuation of enrollment numbers. The process of creating the classes is a well-thought-out process with many staff members involved who work with that grade level. This includes but is not limited to classroom teachers, specialist teachers (Phys. Ed., Music and French) and support staff (Learning Center, Resource, Early Literacy Support and EAL).
