School Lunch Program and Milk

Our school lunch program is scheduled to begin on Monday, September 15th. The new vendor assigned to our school is The Lunch Lady. They will be preparing the meals off site and then will deliver them to the school.

A note that we will not be offering regular or chocolate milk for purchase at lunch. White milk will continue to be available as part of our breakfast program.

Arrival Procedures/Building Access

At 8:15, staff are on duty and that means that parents/guardians can leave students on the school grounds. You are welcome to stay with your child should you wish.

Students will play outside from 8:15-8:25. At 8:25, a bell will sound indicating that students can now enter the building.

During days of inclement weather or extreme cold, the doors will be opened at 8:15 and students will be allowed to enter the building and head straight to their classrooms.

All visitors, including parents/guardians, are asked to check in with the office upon arrival. They are not permitted to walk students to and from their classes for safety and security reasons.

Health Information

It is important that the school have access to the most up to date health information for your child. Please ensure to update records when requested and please inform us of any changes to your child's health. Medications cannot be administered at school without the proper documentation and they must be kept at the office. If your child requires medication while at school, please call the main office at 902-864-6838 and we will ensure that forms are made available for you to fill out and sign.

Emergency Drills

The start of a new school year requires us to practice being safe while at school. One way we do this is to practice exiting the building in case of a fire. School staff will be discussing this in their classrooms, at age-appropriate levels, this week and we will be doing our first drill later in the week. Another way we practice being safe at school is by participating in what we call Lockdown and Hold and Secure Drills. Look for a separate message with more information regarding this in the coming days. The third way that we practice safety is with bus evacuation drills. This is especially important when classes begin to take field trips. The date for this practice drill has yet to be determined but will be communicated as soon it becomes available.

Head Lice

Please ensure that you are checking your child's head frequently for lice. If you find any live lice, or nits, please treat immediately. Students can return to school once they have been treated.

Safe Arrival

If your child is going to be late or absent, please remember to call our toll free attendance line at 1-833-582-6940. The only option available is to excuse the student for the day. If the student arrives later, attendance will be changed upon their arrival.

The objective of the Provincial School Code of Conduct Policy (Code of Conduct) is to establish and maintain safe and inclusive learning and working environments in our school communities. The Code of Conduct establishes expectations for acceptable behaviour of children and students and provides guidance on how schools should respond to and accurately record incidents of unacceptable behaviour. The Code of Conduct supports well-being and achievement by promoting respect of the rights, property, and safety of all. It establishes predictable consequences and pathways for addressing unacceptable behaviour in schools, ensuring responses are clear, consistent, timely, restorative, and equitable.

As the school year progresses, additional information will be shared about how Smokey Drive will be working within the Code of Conduct. For now, I am pleased to share with you our school's new mission statement which will guide our work moving forward.

At Smokey Drive Elementary, we are a kind and safe school where everyone belongs, learns, and grows together with respect everyday.

The Nova Scotia Department of Education and


Early Childhood Development (EECD) has come out

Inclement Weather and School Cancellations

In the event of school cancellation due to inclement weather and other exceptional circumstances, the decision to cancel school is made as close to 6 am as possible. Here are some ways you can find out:

- Sign up to receive text messages from the HRCE

At times schools may be cancelled by "Family of Schools". We are in the Sackville High family of schools. In the event school is cancelled during the school day, the decision is usually made by 11 am. The school will contact all families to confirm procedures to release your children. Please ensure your child knows what to do in case of early closure and ensure that your phone numbers and email addresses are up-to-date so we can contact you. Students are not released until we have made contact with a parent/guardian or designate as you have previously identified.

If school is cancelled during the day, we will dismiss students as per their parent/guardian instruction at 11:30 am. If you can avoid it, do not come to pick your child up early as this will result in a number of parents/guardians in close contact. Parents, guardians and caregivers are requested to wait outside their regular dismissal door at 11:30 am for their children. All students who need to wait for a later pick-up will be supervised until they are picked up.

On days when conditions exist that it is not safe to open schools at the regularly scheduled time but it is predicted that conditions will improve, a 2-hour delayed opening may be considered. In this situation, students cannot arrive before 10:25 and classes will begin at 10:35. Lunch and dismissal times will not be affected.
