Coming into the school

If you are coming into the school building for any reason, please make sure that you check in at the office. Staff will make sure that students/items are dropped off or collected as needed. Visitors are not permitted to move throughout the school for safety and security reasons.



Outdoor Play

Playing and physical activity is an important part of education. At Smokey Drive, we encourage students to get outside, and play with their peers at multiple times during the day, including recesses, lunch and outdoor learning opportunities. Please ensure that students are dressed appropriately for the weather each day. We go outside unless it is raining very hard or extremely cold. Students cannot stay inside when their class goes out as we do not have supervision for them. You may also wish to tuck a change of clothes in your child's backpack in case they get wet or muddy while playing outside.

This allows us to ensure that children are getting safely to their after school place. Also, students are not allowed to be on school grounds before morning staff supervision or

after school without their own

parent/guardian supervision.

Halloween


This year, Halloween falls on Friday, October 31st. More detailed information will be sent to families later this month regarding how this will look at Smokey Drive.

Bus Evacuation

Even though Smokey Drive Elementary is not a bussed school, we still practice bus safety to prepare students for any potential school trips involving travel by bus. This year's bus evacuation will be taking place later this month. Once a date has been confirmed, it will be communicated to you. Consent forms are not required as the practice will be taking place on school grounds. HRCE bus drivers will review bus safety procedures with staff and students and will practice what to do in the event of an emergency. If you have any questions or concerns regarding this, please contact Mrs. Longard at the school.

Food/Cutlery/Water Bottles

Please ensure that you are sending in enough food/snacks with your child to last them throughout the day. It is also important that they come with any/all cutlery needed for those items.

Students also need to bring a full water bottle with them each day. This helps to limit trips to the water fountain during instructional time.

Inclement Weather and School Cancellations

In the event of school cancellation due to inclement weather and other exceptional circumstances, the decision to cancel school is made as close to 6 am as possible. Here are some ways you can find out:

- Sign up to receive text messages from the HRCE

At times schools may be cancelled by "Family of Schools". We are in the Sackville High family of schools. In the event school is cancelled during the school day, the decision is usually made by 11 am. The school will contact all families to confirm procedures to release your children. Please ensure your child knows what to do in case of early closure and ensure that your phone numbers and email addresses are up-to-date so we can contact you. Students are not released until we have made contact with a parent/guardian or designate as you have previously identified.

If school is cancelled during the day, we will dismiss students as per their parent/guardian instruction at 11:30 am. If you can avoid it, do not come to pick your child up early as this will result in a number of parents/guardians in close contact. Parents, guardians and caregivers are requested to wait outside their regular dismissal door at 11:30 am for their children. All students who need to wait for a later pick-up will be supervised until they are picked up.

On days when conditions exist that it is not safe to open schools at the regularly scheduled time but it is predicted that conditions will improve, a 2-hour delayed opening may be considered. In this situation, students cannot arrive before 10:25 and classes will begin at 10:35. Lunch and dismissal times will not be affected.
