

#### **Upcoming Safety Drills**

The safety and security of our students and staff is a top priority for *Smokey Drive Elementary* and the Halifax Regional Centre of Education. This week we will have our first of six *fire drills* of the school year. Another of the procedures our school will be practicing is a lockdown drill. During a *lockdown drill*, classroom doors are secured, and the students remain inside the room until instructed by the teacher to resume their activities. All exterior doors are locked, and no one is permitted to enter or leave the building. Students are kept inside the school and classrooms when circumstances make it safer to stay in the classroom rather than evacuate. Just as we prepare our students to properly respond to a fire drill, they also need to be aware of the proper response during a lockdown drill.

Another practice drill to be conducted is a *hold and secure drill*. During a hold and secure students remain in their classrooms continuing to learn but movement is not permitted in the hallways. The entrances will be locked, and no one will be permitted to enter or leave the building during this drill.

Please be assured that staff at our school will spend time discussing the importance of this procedure with students prior to running a drill. We will also take time after the drills to remind them that it was only a practice and there was no danger. When possible, our School Liaison Officer may assist us in conducting the lockdown drills just as the Fire Department assists with evacuation drills.

Lockdown and Hold and Secure drills are announced ahead of time, so students and staff know they are practice drills. The focus is on practice of the drills, instead of a surprise drills. We practice these drills to ensure our school remains a safe place for teaching and learning.

#### **Head Lice Prevention and Treatment**

With the beginning of a new school year, we often see cases of head lice quite early. By working together, we can all help prevent head lice. Please notify the school immediately if your child has head lice.

If you do discover that your child does have head lice, they <u>must be treated</u>. Consult with your family doctor or pharmacist for treatment options. Here are some tips to remember and share with your child:

- -Never share hats, combs, clips, bands or any type of head gear.
- -Put hats and scarves in coat pockets or sleeve, not on a shelf.
- -Check your child's head regularly.

### **Orange Shirt Day- Every Child Matters**

On September 29th we will observe "Orange Shirt Day". We encourage all staff and students to wear orange shirts. Classes will be learning about the significance of the day. Sept 30 is National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, a day of reflection and further learning to honor those who attended residential schools and the intergenerational impacts of trauma on their families. Treaty Day is October 1 in Nova Scotia, and it kicks off Mi'kmaq History Month.



#### **SchoolsPlus Message**

We want to introduce ourselves as your SchoolsPlus team at Smokey Drive Elementary.

**We have a few different roles in SchoolsPlus:** Assistant Lead – Jen Fougere, Community Outreach Worker – Michelle Boudreau, and Child and Youth Care Practitioner – Charlotte Pike

What is SchoolsPlus? SchoolsPlus is a free, confidential service that is now available in every school in HRCE. You may have heard of us but didn't really know what we do.

What can SchoolsPlus offer? Some of what the SchoolsPlus Assistant Lead and Community Outreach Worker do focus on 3 main areas:

- 1. Help build and support good relationships with families, schools, and the community.
- 2. Connect parents, students, and families with programs, resources, and support. Some examples are: help find social or recreation programs for kids/youth (and the funding, if needed), help connect to/apply for supports that can provide other assistance (i.e., access to tutoring, support with eyeglasses), and navigate systems to get the services you need.
- 3. **Programming for parents and students.** Some examples are: Handle with Care, The Incredible Years, Rainbows, Voices, Roots of Empathy, social skills groups, and more.

We can help support your student/family with connections to what they may need to succeed – from home, to school, and back again.
